Updates for swim21 accredited clubs

During a previous ASA Club Development Management Group meeting (formerly the swim21 National Panel), a decision was made to compile an update following each quarterly meeting (March, June, September and December) and circulate this to all swim21 accredited clubs. The following is the latest update:

Following recent changes to swim21 Essential, revised templates/guidance documents for the Essential module have been added to the ASA website here - <http://www.swimming.org/library/95>.

Please note that changes to the portal are now live in line with the recent changes to swim21 Essential, however your club will still be able to view information from your previous/current accreditations.

The swim21 Working Group are planning to start to look at swim21 Network and Performance modules in the new year – information will be circulated once available.

If you have forgotten your password for the swim21 portal please note there's a 'Forgotten Password' button on the portal login page, which will enable you to change this.

Please note that moving forward we require 'wet' signatures (rather than electronic signatures) for swim21 purposes i.e. for elements 6, 7, 11 and 16.

Please note that DBS 'e' numbers are not acceptable for swim21 – 'e' numbers illustrate that an online application has been made, however the disclosure hasn't been processed at this stage.

If you have club members/previous members who no longer require access to the swim21 portal please email clubdevelopment@swimming.org and we will deactivate respective accounts.



ASA Club Network Age-group Beacon

A new and exciting ASA Club Network Age-group Beacon programme is being piloted in Coventry targeting 11 year olds (2005 born) from the 200IM rankings. The main emphasis of the programme is skill development and long-course training once a month alongside Coach, Parent and Swimmer education workshops.

The programme has been focused around swimmers from clubs within Coventry & Warwickshire, due in main to the location of the existing Beacon programme and age of the swimmers to keep travel to a minimum.

The 28 swimmers from Blythe Barracudas, City of Coventry, Fox Hollies, Nuneaton & Bedworth, Rugby, Solihull and Stratford Sharks took part in the first session in October with the programme running until July 2017.

Regional swim21 benefits for clubs

Two courses of funding are available to assist clubs within the West Midland Region to initiate, implement or maintain swim21 development plans. These are Club Development Grant Aid and Education Course Grant Aid.

Funding is only available to clubs who either have achieved or are working towards swim21 Essential Club accreditation. A club must have a minimum of 8 elements uploaded and approved on the swim21 portal, including Elements 1,2,4 & 13 – Club Development/ Business Plan, Annual Budget, Workforce TNA and Club Personnel Record.

Club Development Grant Aid

The West Midland Club Development Group wishes to encourage clubs to think about projects that will make a significant impact on their club's activities including:

1. Promotion and marketing for the club to increase membership
2. Club Volunteer workforce development
3. Essential equipment for the development of the club members.

Please make sure you read the full grant criteria and conditions and seek guidance from the appropriate Club Development Officer before submitting a grant application to help you with the process.

Education Course Grant Aid

Education Course Grant Aid support is available for up to 50% of the course cost in respect of the following courses:

1. Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 Coaching courses – all disciplines including courses done through RPL.
2. Level 1 and Level 2 Teaching Courses
3. Tutorial and assessment fees only.

Please make sure you are aware of all the grant criteria and conditions. Grant Aid will not be paid retrospectively. **Forms must be received a minimum of 1 week before the course start date or when registered for RPL.** Forms received later than 1 week before the start of a course will be rejected.

Team Manager training is designed to ensure any volunteers who are taking groups of athletes to competitions or camps, locally or abroad, are fully equipped to do their role. Ensuring athletes arrive and return from sporting activities unharmed is a big responsibility and this training will ensure volunteers have all the necessary skills and knowledge to do this with confidence.

Minimum age to attend workshop is 16 years old, although it should be noted that an individual cannot take the role of a Team Manager fully until they turn 18. You have to have completed the Module 1 course before attending a Module 2 course.

Coaching FAQ's

What are the new coaching courses?

The new Level 1 Swimming Assistant (Coaching) and Level 2 Coaching Swimming courses have been designed and developed in order to offer a progressive pathway for coaches providing them with a clear development through to Level 3. The courses utilise new coaching methodologies to ensure that upon completion coaches are up to date with current techniques.

What's the difference between the old Coaching Swimming qualifications and the new courses?

The new courses are not externally regulated qualifications, this change has enabled us to develop a learning programme which meets the needs of the sector rather than being restricted by the requirements of a regulated qualification. This provides us with the flexibility to be able to review the course annually to ensure that it is current and up to date. The courses are endorsed by the ASA and learners will still receive a certificate of competence.

Who's eligible for this course?

There are no pre-requisites for the Level 1 Swimming Assistant (Coaching) course. If you are looking to attend the Level 2 Swimming Coach course you must hold the following:

- Level 1 Swimming Assistant (Coaching)
- ASA Level 1 Award in Coaching Swimming
- An equivalent ASA qualification certificated after 1994

Open Water Courses

When the IoS reviewed feedback on previous years, there was a consistent request for more practical time so that learners could have more time to experience delivering, observing and being a recipient of others coaching, to enhance best practice and have a broader introduction into various open water coaching methods. Following on from this feedback, the IoS have worked hard to implement a new delivery format for the reviewed qualification in 2016/2017.

The first part of the course will be an initial face to face date which will be in a simulated pool environment meaning that the day will not be weather-dependent and enable learners to have guaranteed pool/coaching time. Learners will then have access to the online blended learning, which will allow most of the theory aspects of the programme to be completed online. Dates for completion of the online work will be dependent upon the course you wish to attend. This will be followed by a second face to face day in an open water environment at a venue of your choice

The locations have been hand-picked by our Tutors and staff members and have undergone preliminary checks to ensure the venues meet the delivery requirements for the course.

To complete this qualification coaches will need to have an ASA Level 2 Swimming Coach (since 94) or 1st4Sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Triathlon (QCF) or equivalent. We will also accept ASA Level 2 Swimming Teacher (or equivalent) qualifications providing the learner has proven experience in coaching and open water swimming.

The Guided Learning Hours for this course are 50 of which approximately 16 hours will be spent on face to face delivery with a further 35 hours (approximately) of online learning and assessment.

IoS Vouchers

There are some issues with clubs using their swim21 IoS £100 vouchers. A few clubs have been giving their voucher codes to their members who are using their own individual accounts to book onto courses and then trying to use the voucher. They are then finding that the voucher hasn't worked. The vouchers work as a credit and won't work on another account.

Please note that vouchers have to be used on the club account and the club has to book the courses; these vouchers are non transferable and will not work anywhere else.

Adult Learn to Swim Workshop

In 2015, the ASA Insight Team conducted a segmentation based in motivations and barriers to swimming and activity. Following this, a behaviour change study has allowed the ASA to further understand how to encourage each of these segments to swim, or swim more. From this research, insights around improving the swimming confidence and ability were gained.

Therefore in order to increase adult swimming participation, there is a need to improve the swimming ability and confidence of adults in England which could lead to lifelong participation in swimming, and develop a habit.

"The ASA has also revealed that one in five adults is unable to swim, which shows a need for adult swimming lessons which cater to the needs of older swimmers." This led to the NEW ASA Adult Swimming Framework which is about improving confidence, competence and technique with no age limit.

The NEW ASA Adult Framework caters for every type of adult swimmer, including those who are unable to swim at all, beginners and those who are nervous about swimming. There is also support for swimmers who are coming back to swimming after a break or just those who want to improve their technique.

Confident swimmers are also given the opportunity to improve all of the four strokes, go into the competitive side of swimming or to join a Masters club.

To support the launch of the framework and to assist operators and teachers in the delivery; The ASA would like to invite you to attend a **FREE** Adult Learn to swim workshop.

The workshops will be held across the country and are completely free of charge to attend.

Each event will host two workshops; the first is for teachers to find out more about how best to deliver adult lessons including adaptations, dealing with concerns, teaching tips and practices.

The other workshop is for operators, managers and marketing departments to look at the best ways to timetable, promote and advertise adult lessons.
