Updates for swim21 accredited clubs

At a recent Regional Club Development Group meeting a decision was made to update the Regional Grant Aid support & Club Development Grant criteria.

Regional Grant Aid updates

- Available to Coaches and Teachers from swim21 accredited clubs only.
- The Region will withdraw the grant offer if it is not claimed within 6 months of the course end date.
- Grant Aid is limited to a maximum of 50% towards the cost of a coaching course and 25% towards a teaching course.

Please make sure you are aware of all the grant criteria and conditions. Grant Aid will not be paid retrospectively. Forms must be received a minimum of 1 week before the course start date or when registered for RPL. Forms received later than 1 week before the start of a course will be rejected.

Club Development Grants updates

- Clubs must be swim21 accredited.
- Grant Aid will not be given for:
 - Laptops, printers and other electrical equipment including photographic and video recording devices and electronic starting equipment
 - VAT, delivery and fitting costs
 - Permanent fixtures and fittings for pools not solely used by the club i.e; lane-ropes and backstroke flags.
- Grant aid is limited to a maximum grant of £2,500 providing relevant West Midland regional funds are available.
- Grant aid will be reviewed and agreed within 4 weeks of submission of the application form.

Clubs please note: In line with the ASA rebrand the swim21 name and logo will be changing very soon. Please be aware this is brand change only and won't affect the elements or criteria for accreditation. Details of these changes will be sent to all affiliated clubs shortly. The English Schools Swimming Association (ESSA) Inter-divisional Championships Results

The English Schools Swimming Association (ESSA) Inter divisional Championships took place in Liverpool over the weekend of 11th and 12th March. Eight regional teams take part in these championships – North West, North East, West Midlands, East Midlands, South West, London, East and South East and the competition is very tight. For the first time in 67 years, the West Midlands team won the ESSA Inter divisional Championships by one point from the South East Region.

Not only did the West Midlands team win overall, they also won 4 of the 6 age groups which were:

Junior Boys (12/13) Inter Boys (14/15) Inter Girls (14/15) Inter Girls (14/15) Senior Girls (16/17/18)

The Intermediate boys were particularly strong with some individuals breaking records: Jacob Davies in 100m Backstroke

Adam Metcalf in 200m Freestyle

Charlie Hutchison in 200m Butterfly & 200m Individual Medley.

The Intermediate boys also broke ESSA Long Course records in: 4 x 100m Medley Relay & 4 x 100m Freestyle Relay

This is a great effort from all individuals and a great result for the region as the North and South are usually tough competition.

Also superb support from most swimming clubs and performance centres with the team led by coaches John Dougall (Wyre Forest) and Joe Dearing (Haden Hill).

National Updates



New Procedure for Poolside Accreditation at ASA National Events 1st April 2017 onwards

From 1st April 2017, the ASA is implementing changes when applying for a Poolside Accreditation for ASA National events. These are the same changes, which are also implemented at British Swimming events.

Please read the following information carefully and make the necessary preparations well in advance to ensure a successful application process. Annual passes are not available. Late surcharges will not apply. All coaches, team managers and chaperones must fulfil the following criteria, as required by their role, when applying for a pass to attend any ASA National events:

All coaches, team managers and chaperones must provide evidence of: From 1st April 2017

- 1. DBS: valid Disclosure and Barring Service check (DBS)
- 2. Minimum Qualification/Requirements (specific to the role):
 - a. Coaches Teaching/Coaching Qualification Level 1
 - b. Team Manager Team Manager Training Module 1 Certificate
 - c. Chaperone Club authorisation to be acting in loco parentis on behalf of the Club

2018 onwards

3. Safeguarding Certificate: in preparation for 2018 requirements, during 2017 all coaches, team managers and chaperones are required to update and record their Safeguarding qualification (wherever awarded) with ASA Membership Department.

Coaches, team managers and chaperones will not be able to apply for a Poolside Accreditation without the above documents in place.
