Updates & General Information for SwimMark Clubs

During a previous Swim England Club Management Group meeting (formerly the swim21 National Panel), a decision was made to compile an update following each quarterly meeting (March, June, September and December) and circulate this to all accredited clubs. The following is the latest update:-

SwimMark Updates:-

- E7 and E13 Please note that minor amendments have been made to these elements in relation to Swim England membership.
- E14 just a quick reminder that all Safeguarding training should be refreshed every three years, unless stated otherwise by the respective training provider. Please refer to the guidance document within element 14 if you would like to check which courses are acceptable for SwimMark.
- There is a new 'Best Practice' tab on the portal please refer to this if you wish to view examples of best practice for each of the Essential elements.
- The SwimMark Network module now lasts for two years (with an annual health check at 12 months) and still covers three elements a Development/Business Plan, Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and a Training Needs Analysis (TNA).
- The Performance Module will also last for two years (again with an annual health check) from December 2017, however the performance criteria is currently being reviewed for all disciplines (Swimming, Diving, Water Polo and Synchronised Swimming).

If you have current club members/previous members who no longer require access to the online portal please email clubdevelopment@swimming.org and we will deactivate the respective accounts.

If you have forgotten your password for the portal please utilise the 'Forgotten Password' button on the portal login page, which will enable you to change this.

Changes to Swim England Club Membership

Swim England have been reviewing their club membership and have decided to implement some changes which will come into effect in 2018.

Renewals submission

The introduction of the Online Membership System (OMS) in 2012 streamlined the administration of renewals data. This means that clubs are now submitting their renewals earlier every year. To make sure that clubs and members are properly insured for the activities they are taking part in, we have made the decision to bring the submission of the renewals deadline forward to the **28 February** for 2018.

To help with this, and to alleviate some of the challenges clubs experience when adding new member details, a new version of OMS will allow prospective members to enter their data using an online form. This will automatically be uploaded onto the your OMS for approval before it is submitted to us.

Membership cards

From January 2018 membership cards will no longer be issued to clubs for your members. We feel that removing the need to send out cards to members will alleviate some of the workload for clubs.

New members will now receive an email from Swim England once we have processed their details. This will tell them all about their Swim England membership benefits and how they can access the Online Membership System (OMS) to view and update their details. Members will also get an email when their membership is renewed.

Team Manager training is designed to ensure any volunteers who are taking groups of athletes to competitions or camps, locally or abroad, are fully equipped to do their role. Ensuring athletes arrive and return from sporting activities unharmed is a big responsibility and this training will ensure volunteers have all the necessary skills and knowledge to do this with confidence.

The workshop is free of charge.

Minimum age to attend workshop is 16 years old, although it should be noted that an individual cannot take the role of a Team Manager fully until they turn 18.

Time to Listen Workshop

Swim England has linked up with the NSPCC and is accredited to deliver the 'Time to Listen' module that is aimed at Club Welfare Officers (CWOs). Whilst it is appreciated that some CWOs will be trained and experienced in child protection issues, the Time to Listen programme provides the opportunity to consider the roles and responsibilities of CWOs and the action taken should any incident occur.

Time to Listen training is a requirement for Welfare Officers as part of SwimMark Essential Club Accreditation. The workshop is free of charge, although a £20 deposit is required to book onto the course, refundable on attendance.
